Mr Joel Melton, Consultant Knee Surgeon



Mr Melton is a specialist knee surgeon. He was trained in the Wessex region during which time he was awarded the FRCS in Trauma and Orthopaedics followed by the CCT in Orthopaedics and Trauma surgery. He spent a year of fellowship training in knee surgery in Sydney, Australia working at the world renowned North Sydney Orthopaedic and Sports Medicine Centre with founder of the clinic, Dr Mervyn Cross and his team. Here, he was trained further in all aspects of sports medicine, the management of knee ligament injuries and knee replacement techniques. He has also spent time completing fellowship training in limb reconstruction techniques in Russia and in France. He has attended international training courses and specialist meetings in the USA, Australia and throughout Europe. Mr Melton completed a Masters degree in Orthopaedic Engineering (Cardiff University) and regularly applies his knowledge of biomechanics and engineering to his clinical practice.

Mr Doug Hay, Consultant Spinal Surgeon

Mr Doug Hay's practice covers the whole spectrum of spinal disorders, including degenerative conditions of neck and lumbar spine, tumour, infection, trauma and adult scoliosis. He joins John Crawford, supporting our very busy spinal clinics both at the Nuffield and Spire Lea.



Dr Gavin Clunie, Consultant Rheumatologist



Dr Clunie is a Rheumatologist and Metabolic Bone Physician (NHS work at Addenbrooke's). He has been a Consultant Rheumatologist for 12y and has had a substantial subspecialty interest in metabolic bone diseases, osteoporosis included, for much longer.

Dr Clunie is a general Rheumatologist as well as Metabolic Bone Physician and he sees patients with (or possibly with) all types of inflammatory arthritis, soft-tissue problems and widespread musculoskeletal pain. He has a particular interest in patients with, or family history of psoriasis - who are prone to a range of musculoskeletal disorders, loosely termed Psoriatic Arthritis.

Dr Clunie has pioneered the development of Fracture Liaison Services in The UK working with Department of Health over the last 5y; and he has been Director of DXA scanning Units in both Ipswich and London (UCL). He has published research in both bone and rheumatological diseases and is the author/editor of 3 textbooks - 2 in Rheumatology (Oxford Handbook and Desk-Reference) and one on Osteoporosis.

Previously Dr Clunie has run research projects in Shoulder Disorders and Ankylosing Spondylitis / Spondylarthropathy
